## GENERAL INFORMATION

1. All show information, registration forms, etc., are available on the ABHA website at [www.blackhereford.org](http://www.blackhereford.org) .
2. All animals must be registered/recorded in the ABHA
3. The owner of the animal(s) being exhibited must be in good standing with the Association
4. The entry fee for exhibition is \$25 per animal.
5. Show Registrations must be postmarked by January 31, 2018.
6. A copy of the registration certificate for each animal entered in the show must accompany the registration/entry form(s). If the registration/entry form(s) is submitted electronically, a photo copy of each ABHA registration certificate must be submitted along with the required registration/entry fees to the KBHA at the aforementioned address.
7. Registration/Entry: Registration/Entry form(s) and payment should be filled out completely and submitted by the set deadline, electronically to [hereford@walterscattle.com](mailto:hereford@walterscattle.com) or printed and submitted by mail to the below address:

8. Animals will be accepted on Wednesday, February 21, 2018 from Noon to 9pm and Thursday, February 22, 2018 from 9 am to 12 pm local time. They will be checked in by KBHA Reps.
9. NO animals are allowed in the Barn prior to 9 am Wednesday, February 21, 2018.
- 10. NO DOGS will be allowed in the barn area or show arena.**

## FITTING AND SHOWING GUIDELINES

1. Only one person will be allowed to lead each entry in the showing.
2. Any exhibitor who loses control of his/her entry more than twice in the showing will be asked to remove the animal from the ring.
3. All entries must be on time for their respective class. Once the entries in the exhibitor's respective class have begun walking into the profile view, the exhibitor is too late and ineligible to compete.
4. All bulls must be shown with a nose lead.
5. Each exhibitor is responsible for having his/her animal(s) presented in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification, except for the grooming of hair and hooves. The exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed. Painting of white skin and surgical alteration of an animal's conformation or appearance is prohibited. Altering the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), with the exception of false tail switches. The use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances used externally are also prohibited. Other prohibited products include those used internally

such as steroids, illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals or artificial filling. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing. All entries are subject to visual inspection and/or laboratory testing. The exhibitor of any entry found to be in violation of the above rules will be disqualified from exhibiting at future Association-sponsored shows.

6. The act of artificially filling animals internally, which includes stomach pumping, drench tubes or any other method by mouth or esophagus is prohibited
7. Any animal upon check-in, which does not have legible permanent identification marks (ear tattoo) corresponding to the permanent identification on its registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect, illegible, or absence of a permanent identification mark, animals cannot be permanently identified and re-checked at the show.
8. All entries must meet Kentucky Health Regulations. Entries must have a current official health certificate from your veterinarian. Kentucky Law specifies that all animals have a Metal ID Tag to enter/exit the state. Make sure that all Kentucky health regulations are met.
9. The individual classes will be made up and divided after the cattle are checked in at the show. They will be judged from the youngest class to the oldest within each class.
10. Each exhibitor must wear registration/entry numbers on their backs.
11. If all the rules, regulations and requirement of the show are not met, the show management reserves the right to disqualify any entry.

## CLASSES

### Open F1, Heifer and Bull divisions

ABHA registered heifers and bulls and F1 heifers with ABHA issued NR certificate born after December 31, 2016, are eligible to compete.

### Pride of Kentucky Junior Division

Any ABHA registered born after December 31, 2016, born and raised in Kentucky are eligible to compete.

### Junior Showmanship Division

Any ABHA Junior member is eligible to compete with the ABHA registered heifer of their choice.

## AMENITIES AND FACILITIES

Show will be held at the LD Brown Agricultural Center, Western Kentucky University, in Bowling Green KY on Friday, February 23rd at noon.

Wash stalls and tie outs will be available both indoor and outdoor, bedding is provided by the facility. You are encouraged to bring your generator. Generator use is only permitted outside of the building.
